Introduction

Cannon Park Primary School is very proud of its school uniform and promotes pride in the children to wear the correct uniform to represent the school and what it means to us all in the community.

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in school-organised events outside normal school hours. We ask children to wear their shirts tucked into their skirts or trousers and to take a pride in their personal appearance. Some items of uniform can be bought from Andy Blair Sports and Leisure, 88-90 Barker Butts Lane, CV6 1DY, whilst others are easily available, at very competitive prices, at local shops including supermarkets. A complete list of the items needed for school uniform including those for Physical Education, is listed at the end of the document.

Aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in our school;
- helps to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- identifies the children with the school;
- supports our commitment to inclusion;
- prevents children from wearing 'fashion clothes' that could be distracting in class;
- is practical, smart and designed with health and safety in mind;
- is considered good value for money by most parents;

Jewellery, Hair Ornaments, Make-up and Nail Varnish

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exceptions to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance. Children are required to remove any items during PE lessons to prevent them from causing injury.

Please note: Teachers are not permitted to remove earrings.

Any small items of religious significance, which cannot be removed, should be covered with a sweatband.

If a parent wishes to pierce the ears of their child, it is recommended that this takes place at the start of the summer holiday. This allows the child to keep the earrings in after they are first pierced.

Ribbons or 'scrunchies' should be plain and unadorned. Hair bands/hair accessories should be plain and flat with no additions i.e. ears, bows, flowers etc.

Make up and nail varnish should not be worn to school unless for an out of school hours function, for example a school disco. Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school.

Long hair should be tied back at all times. The use of styling products should be kept to a minimum and children should not have decorative patterns cut into their hair or have hair coloured or dyed.

Footwear

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear shoes with platform soles or high heels. All children are required to wear plain black smart shoes (not black trainers) as stated in the uniform list. If boots are worn these should also be plain black. If boots are large and prevent children from sitting comfortably on the floor they may be asked to change into their PE shoes whilst inside the school building.

The Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items. If a parent has difficulties for any reason with fulfilling this request they are asked to speak confidentially to a member of staff to discuss the issues. Parents should be assured that we will do all we can to help. Parents will be contacted to discuss the matter, if children arrive at school wearing non-school uniform clothing. The same system will apply for children who do not have a PE kit.

If there are serious reasons, for example on religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will consider such requests accordingly. If any parent would like to request a modification to the uniform policy they should, in the first instance, contact the Head Teacher.

The Role of Governors

The Governing Body supports the head teacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Head Teacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the Governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school uniform policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

Monitoring and Review

The Governing Body monitors and reviews the school uniform policy through its committee work by:

- seeking the views of parents, to ensure that they agree with and support the policy;
- considering, with the Head Teacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform;

School Uniform List (All school uniform and P.E. kit MUST be named.)

Our school uniform colour is a combination of red and grey/black. Most items can be bought from supermarkets. Items marked with a * below, some of which have the school logo on, are available from Andy Blair Sports and School Wear (Barker's Butts Ln, Coundon, Coventry CV6 1DY).

Please note skirts and shorts should be an appropriate length and of a style which allows children to sit comfortably on the floor.

Your child should wear shoes which he or she can manage to do up independently. Please do not send your child to school in shoes which prevent them from running in the playground. If boots are worn these also should be plain black.

P.E. Kit (All school uniform and P.E. kit MUST be named.)

On the days on which a child has a P.E. lesson, they must come to school wearing full P.E. kit.
